Energy Efficiency

House Bill 19-1231 - New Appliance Energy and Water Efficiency Standards

- Updates and adopts standards for certain new appliances, plumbing fixtures and other products sold for residential or commercial use meet energy efficiency and water efficiency standards that will be phased in over 3 years. Sale of a non-complying product is punishable through a civil enforcement action by the Attorney General.

House Bill 19-1260 - Building Energy Codes

- Requires local jurisdictions to adopt one of the 3 most recent versions of the International Energy Conservation Code (ICC) , at a minimum, when updating any other building code.



Electric Vehicles

SB77 - Electric Utility EV Plans

- Starting in summer 2020 and every 3 years after that IOUS file a plan

SB239 - Commercial Vehicle Impacts

- CDOT will convene stakeholders and develop rules for commercial vehicles

HB1159 - Tax Credits

- Extends tax credits for EVs and hydrogen vehicles from 2021 to 2025.

HB1198 - EV Grant Fund

- Allows EV grant funds to be used for administration of charging station grants and to offset charging station operating costs.



SB96 - Collecting Climate Data

- AQCC draft rule by July 1, 2020

SB1261 - Climate Action Plan

- Statewide GHG reductions of 26% by 2025, 50% by 2030 and 90% by 2050
- AQCC will issue rules



Electricity and Utility Policies

HB1003 - Solar Gardens Modernization Act

- Increase to 5MW and removes contiguity requirement

SB236 - PUC Reauthorization

- Regulation of Tri-State electric resource plan
- Carbon pricing, distribution system planning rules,
- Investigation of performance based regulation and markets
- Requires Xcel to submit a clean energy plan to reach 80% GHG reductions by 2030



Additional Policies

SB181 - Public Welfare Oil and GS

- Local control of oil and gas development

HB1272 - Housing Authority

- Clarifies housing authority participation in C-PACE

HB1314 - Just Transition

- Creates Just Transition Office
- Provides benefits to coal workers
- Grants to impacted local communities
